7:00 Nancy Ramsay lead the Zonta Blessing and business meeting was begun. She then introduced our 2 guests, Mary Lou Fine and Pam Jackson, both members of the Loudon Zonta Club before it disbanded, and interested in joining us as Arlington Club members.

Virginia McGee presented the minutes from the February 25 meeting; and with no edits or additions, they were approved by all.

There was no Treasurer's report because Ellie Karro's return from vacation was delayed by a medical emergency. We were reminded that dues are due by May, and that Ellie will be sending out an "invoice" when she returns.

Janie DiSalvo reminded us that, after the April 18 Wine Seminar, each member needs to PLEASE fill out the Service Hours/ Fundraising form that she handed out, submitting it in May for the annual Service Report.

Margo Sheridan reported that she is on a Zonta International Membership committee, and she needs to gather some ideas for bringing new members in to ZI. Margo Sheridan continued where we left off last month, reviewing and assigning tasks, food & supplies needed for our April 18 Wine Seminar, as follows:

8- Nancy Ramsay has arranged for a vendor to do a Jewelry table, and another one who will sell handbags. Some of the proceeds will be donated to the club.

9- Members took on a lot of tasks, noted here, as a back up to the list that Margo made. These include:

## DOORWAYS EXPANDS MISSION TO SUPPORT SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT

For more than 37 years, Doorways for Women and Families has listened to our clients and our community in order to build programs and services that best meet the needs of our most vulnerable neighbors. We've grown and adapted many times along the way - expanding to address family homelessness in addition to domestic violence, providing a long-term pathway to stability with permanent supportive housing and developing family-strengthening, therapeutic services aimed at helping adults and children heal from trauma, regain independence and build brighter futures.

Today, I am proud to share that we have reached another important milestone: the expansion of our mission to incorporate emergency support services for survivors of sexual assault.

For decades, we have helped survivors of domestic violence address and recover from the traumas of every form of abuse, including sexual violence. In fact, nearly 60% of sexual assaults occur within a domestic violence relationship. While domestic violence and sexual assault can also be unique in many ways, our 37-year history of providing a timely, compassionate and well informed response to those in crisis made our decision to expand our services to survivors of stranger-based sexual assault a relatively easy one.

For the past several months, we have been working with the county and our community partners to define the best possible community response for survivor of sexual assault. Within that coordinated response, Doorways will take on several new, but complimentary roles: providing a 24-hour hotline response, offering hospital accompaniment and emergency counseling, and connecting survivors to the county's full range of support and services.

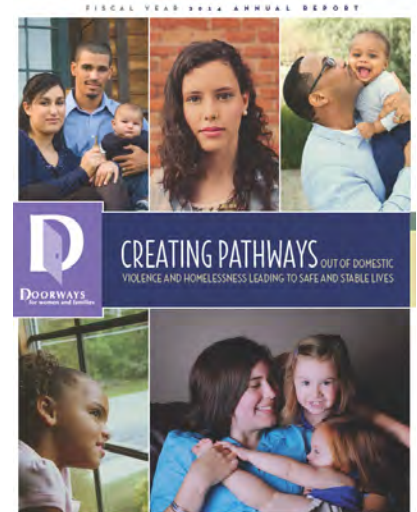
Beginning immediately, Doorways new, comprehensive hotline, Arlington's 24-Hour Domestic & Sexual Violence Hotline will offer survivors a single resource where they can access police and legal assistance, medical assistance, counseling, safety planning and education, advocacy and accompaniment, and safe shelter. Accessing each of these critical elements begins with a call for help - a call that we will proudly answer quickly and at any time of day or night. From this expanded hotline response, Doorways highly trained staff and volunteers will also be available to accompany survivors of sexual assault to area hospitals for exams and treatment. During this extremely painful and confusing time, we will stand ready to offer what is most needed: support, compassion and guidance.

Our community is seeing record numbers of people reaching out for help. The increased media attention on sexual assault provides us all with an opportunity to talk about this critical issue. Doorways is proud of the new role will be playing in Arlington's response to survivors. Look for our Spring Newsletter to provide more information on this important expansion. A Message from Charlie Meng

Dear Friends,

I am writing to keep you updated on the County Board's budget deliberations as they relate to AFAC.

Below is a letter that I recently sent to the Arlington County Board. The Board is hearing public testimony tonight on the budget that the County Manager has submitted. For the first time, increased funding for AFAC is included in the Department of Human Services grant budget, and is noted as one of the main objectives in the County Manager's cover letter transmitting the Budget to the Board. I am encouraged by this development, and ask that if you should see any of the Board members in the next few weeks, please tell them to "Protect AFAC's funding or increase it."

Ladies & Gentlemen:

You would normally be hearing from me at this time, asking for an appointment to plead Arlington Food Assistance Center's (AFAC) case for additional funding. The message I would bring, though, is the very same message we discussed in the summer, and since then on numerous occasions. Nonetheless, at your convenience, I would be pleased to meet with you and any other Arlington County representatives to further discuss AFAC's work in our community, the growing number of Arlington families AFAC is serving, and the resulting financial challenges that AFAC is facing.

Very simply, AFAC saw a 26% increase in client demand in FY 14, and we are already 26.9% ahead of last year - a total of 52.9% more clients in less than 2 years. The reason is equally simple. In November 2013, Sequester cuts to SNAP took effect, and then additional cuts to SNAP were made when the Farm Bill passed. We had been seeing a reduction in the number of families as the Recession abated, but since November 2013, the number of families coming to AFAC has only increased dramatically. We are now serving an average of 2,118 families each week - 5,043 individuals - all of whom are Arlington County residents. I do not expect these numbers to abate. In fact, as the cost of living continues to rise in Arlington, and the Federal SNAP and other safety-net programs continue to be cut, client demand will only increase. Unfortunately, the cuts to SNAP are a long-term structural change, shifting responsibility from the federal government to local non-profits like AFAC.

This has affected AFAC in two important ways. First, donated food which once provided 60% of what we distributed to our families now amounts to only 40% of the food distributed - even though we are on target to raise 1.3 million pounds of donated food this year. The result is that in FY 2014, our food purchase budget was overspent by over \$150,000. We are facing a similar deficit in FY 2015, and if nothing is done, an even larger deficit in FY 2016 and following years.

Secondly, while we have been very effective in raising the necessary funds, food, and volunteer help, donations have not increased fast enough to match the increase in families - even though we are raising more funds than ever before. The funds that the County provides are restricted to food purchases. AFAC must cover all of the other expenses of AFAC's operations including, in FY 2016 an additional \$500,000 for our Food Purchase Budget over and above what the County provides.

Let me underscore that AFAC is raising 93% of what it takes to operate AFAC; we receive no federal or state funds. Unlike other non-profits that can rely on federal and state support programs, the Federal approach to food insecurity is through SNAP - there are no funding opportunities for the very basic work AFAC does.

If you wish to look at a pure cost benefit analysis, the funds provided by the County are leveraged 11 times over in just one year. For a contribution of \$342,000, County residents receive \$5.5 million in services. But we do much more than that. We are helping the least fortunate in our community raise themselves up to be contributing members of our county and our country.

We are greatly heartened by the support AFAC has received from the Department of Human Services and from the County Manager. Now, I want to ask you to retain the increased level of funding provided in the budget submitted by the County Manager. You will be helping AFAC, but more importantly you will be helping the many Arlington residents who come to AFAC seeking help.
